

The musicians of **La Gioconda** learned their baroque musical skills in the most important educational facilities in Europe and the USA. They play and sing with chambermusic ensembles and various baroque orchester all over Europe. La Gioconda is price winner of the special ensemble price of the 6<sup>th</sup> Johann-Heinrich-Schmelzer competition during the 'Internationale Barocktage Stilft Melk 2008' and the ensemble gives performances all over Austria and this year the first CD with christmascantats by Georg Philipp Telemann will be published. Next to their very busy performing timetable two of the musicians teach at the university of art in Graz and the Johann-Josef-Fux conservatory in Graz.

Margot Oitzinger studied in Graz with Rosemarie Schmied and Tom Sol. She also participated in several renaissance and baroque courses with Jill Feldman, Emma Kirkby and Peter Kooij. She is second price winner of the International Johann-Sebastian-Bach competition in Leipzig 2008 and also second price winner of the international baroque singing competition in Chimay (Belgium) 2006. As a soloist she worked with ensembles such as The Dunedin Consort, the Concerto Copenhagen, L'Orfeo Barockorchester, the Wiener Akademie, Le concert Lorrain, the Capella Savaria and the Capella Leopoldina. As a soloist and ensemble singer she appeared in festivals like the Händelfestival in Halle, Bachfest Leipzig, Styriarte, or ,steirischer Herbst'.
